
### First Presbyterian Church of South Charleston (FPCSC) Christian Education Committee 2019 Annual Report


The Christian Education Committee has coordinated many special events and provided opportunities for Christian Education and fellowship for our congregation in the past year. Here are some highlights of the wonderful events, activities, and programming hosted by the FPCSC Christian Education Committee . . .

#### 2019 Adult Bible Study

In Winter and Spring 2019, Adult Bible Study leader Tom Davis helped attendees grow in God's Word through his curriculum, "Loving God by Trusting God".




In Fall and Winter 2019, through his curriculum "Responding to God's Grace", leader Tom Davis helped Adult Bible Study attendees to learn about the grace that God offers to all of us and how best to respond to that grace individually and when reaching out to others.



#### Spring and Fall 2019 - Welcome on Wednesday (WOW)

Wednesday evening activities for children of all ages featured a lesson with Miss Lisa (Calderwood), crafts with Miss Amanda (Fuller), and Music with Mr. Joe (Fuller) and Dr. Mark Hornbaker.

The children's Spring curriculum came from the book *Dinosaur Devotions*. These devotions and activities blended fun dinosaur facts with a deeper understanding of God's Word, which made for faith-filled, fun adventures! Elijah (who is a not-so-secret dinosaur afficionado) was our only regular attendee, but he was happy to be the only one and loved discussing all things dinosaurs. He also enjoyed ending the evening with piano practice with Mark H.



Also in the Spring, Pastor Sharon and Cheryl Eary continued their WOW "Live Your Best Life" series with community-wide guest speaker events, focusing on topics like "Productive Conversations", "Resources for Addiction", "Living a Mindful Life", "Intro to the Enneagram", "South Charleston . . . What's happening around our city!", "Knowing First Aid Could Make You a Lifesaver", and "Elk City!!! What's new and What's coming!" They also offered the "Financial Peace University" program to both church and community members.



The children's Fall curriculum came from the book *Indescribable: 100 Devotions for Kids About God and Science*, a unique and creative devotional for kids. This book really tapped into the natural wonder and discovery that kids experience when talking about God and science. Through the book's scriptures, "did you know" facts, and fun science-based activities and crafts, the kids were able to learn about the story of God in a physical way, where they could immediately look around and experience God's words and creation, rather than just hearing the same old Bible stories they are used to hearing. The Fall WOW children's program was more well-attended than the Spring program, with an average of 4-6 kids each Wednesday.



For the Fall 2019 WOW Adult Bible Study, Pastor Sharon led a discussion-style class in the Sanctuary.

#### April 2019 - Easter/Spring Festival

Adults and older youth volunteered to lead stations, where children of all ages were able to participate in crafts, egg dyeing, cookie decorating and (of course) egg hunts!



#### June 2019 - Youth Yard Sale

The annual Youth Yard Sale was a huge hit, as always. The Youth met their \$1000 goal and were able to pay for a year of sponsorship for their Friends of Ft. Liberté sponsor child. Thank you to all who volunteered, donated items, and shopped!

### June 2019 - Vacation Bible School - VBS: Power Up!

This year's VBS theme was "Power Up! Raise Your Game" and included activities for preschool through elementary age kids, including music, crafts, games, and Bible stories. Pastor Sharon hosted an Adult Bible Study class in the Sanctuary after kids finished their opening program. The goal of her class was to get participants to talk about how their faith has affected their lives by "telling their stories". It was a fun way to get congregation members to learn about each other and share their life lessons and stories with each other.



#### August 2019 - Youth Group Alumni Open House (100th Anniversary Event)

Lisa C. hosted an open house in the youth room for current and former FPCSC youth, prior to the all-church cookout celebrating the church's 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Attendees looked through countless scrapbooks, photo albums, loose photos, and memorabilia and enjoyed reminiscing with other former youth group members about their adventures as youth at First Presby throughout the years.

#### September 2019 - Rally Day

In September, we celebrated Rally Day Sunday with a carry-in breakfast for all ages to kick off the Christian Education program for the Fall and coming year. This event happens each year to help bring to order again our Sunday morning adult class and Welcome on Wednesday (WOW) events. Rally Day inspires us and calls everyone together for the common action of reviving our spirits in study of God, the Bible, and all things relevant to being an active part of our FPCSC family.

This event gave members a chance to talk with Sunday School teacher Tom Davis and his class members and Christian Education Committee members to learn about upcoming programs. We also took the time to enjoy icebreaker activities, games, and a delicious meal together. Good food, good fellowship, and lots of fun were had by all who participated.

#### September 2019 - Camp Craft Party

In September, we hosted an all-ages camp-themed craft event, complete with tie-dye, painted rocks, and friendship bracelets. And of course, s'mores for snacks! This event was a huge hit with kids and adults alike and was a great chance for the Youth to bring their friends and spend with each other.

This year's event was another huge success and garnered even more community support and participation. This is a joint event – planned, executed and co-hosted by the Christian Education and Fellowship committees.

This family-friendly Christmas event was a huge hit with all ages! We provided the supplies, and attendees built their own unique gingerbread houses. We even had a special guest – SANTA – who took the time to read to the kids and take photos with them.

Fellowship, "the food and fun" committee, has coordinated many special events and provided opportunities for fellowship for our congregation in the past year.

This system works very well and enables us to provide this fellowship opportunity independent of any pledge monies. We are grateful to all the groups who freely give of their time to prepare the food for Church Chat. This event is well-attended by the congregation with usually 40 to 50 participants.

*Welcome on Wednesday (WOW)*, our Wednesday evening activity, featured catered meals prepared by Robin Joseph of R-3C's Catering, Becky Smith and the Fellowship Committee from mid-March to May 1. After dinner, participants attended community-oriented programs with guest speakers, participated in church member led cooking classes and/or joined the weekly Chancel Choir practice. The food part of WOW was discontinued May 1 due to low attendance. The Spring Festival, conducted along with the Education and Mission Committees, was held in the Fellowship Hall.

This year we prepared a spaghetti dinner for the South Charleston High School football team prior to one of their games. It was so nice to meet such polite and gracious young men. In exchange, they helped us with Trunk or Treat.

One of the main highlights of the year was working with the **Church 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** Committee. We coordinated the Sunday after church catered reception with Chastity Thomas of Tastefully Dun Catering.

Other highlights of the year included the **Pentecost chili luncheon** in May, **Vacation Bible School dinners** the first week of July, the **September** 



church picnic at Little Creek Park, and the November annual retreat at the Bluestone Conference Center. The Committee coordinated the Bluestone registration and reservations and provided the Church Chat food on this weekend.

### Missions Committee

2019 Annual Report

If you ask any member of the First Presbyterian Church of South Charleston to describe our church, invariably they begin with the statement, "*We are a mission driven church*." In fact, that is what it says on our website!

Despite advancing ages and sometimes declining numbers, 2019 saw this church continue to show the love of Christ by reaching out to the community through our various missions. In some cases, the distinctions between missions, education, and fellowship were blurred as joint projects were carried out. The overall result was a full year of service to our church and our community.



2019 saw 1<sup>st</sup> Presbyterian continue to work and serve the Haiti Mission. It was supported by fundraising, missionaries, and planning work done by volunteers.



We supported the Bluestone Conference Center with two fund raisers and camping scholarships for all of the youth of 1<sup>st</sup> Presby



*Through the WOW program, we were able to hold a Fall Festival for the students at Oakhurst Child Development Center and the youth of 1<sup>st</sup> Presby* 



We continued our support for the Oakhurst Child Development Center.



We provided over \$5000 dollars to fund projects at Davis Stuart – a home for children in transition in Lewisburg, WV. We also provided \$500 worth of Christmas to the female residents

#### **Other 2019 Mission Projects**

- 1. The Furniture Mission in conjunction with Heart and Hand, this mission was continued in the Summer of 2019. *Thanks to Tom Titus and others for coordinating*.
- 2. Christmas Baskets for 50 area families were prepared and delivered. The cost per basket was 70 dollars and was mostly covered by donations from the congregation. *We are especially grateful to Kathy Johnson for coordinating this project every year.*
- 3. Our church held a fund raiser for **Habitat for Humanity** and we supplied a work crew for a Habitat build in North Charleston. *Dave Long coordinated this effort*.



- 4. We had members working at Manna Meals, helping at Sojourners, supporting the Men's Shelter, volunteering at Heart and Hand, ...
- 5. And we did even more

#### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS:**

#### **PAINT PROJECTS:**

The paint projects completed in 2019 included the three-level paneling and walls of the Bstreet entrance, three outside porches and the doors and walls leading into the Sanctuary. The work required the assistance of volunteers (Bob Lilly, Joe Fuller) as it involved almost two weeks for completion.

#### **EXTERIOR LIGHT INSTALLATION**

The exterior light project was completed April 23 by custodian David Smith with assistance from property committee members.

#### YOUTH ROOM IMPROVEMENTS

The improvements included:

- Removal of unwanted furniture and appliances
- Mounting of a T.V. set to the wall
- Installation of shelving

#### LED LIGHTING INSTALLATION

At no cost to the Church, LED lighting fixtures were installed in the Fellowship Hall and in the CDC director's office. John and Sandy Melton provided the initiative and necessary contacts with the installer for this project.

#### SIGNAGE

New signage throughout the Church was installed. Pastor Sharon and Bob Lilly provided the direction and installation of this project

#### INSULATION OF FEEDER PIPES TO THE HEATERS IN CDC CLASSROOMS

Insulated tape was installed on several hot feeder pipes in CDC classrooms to prevent possible injury to the children.

#### **CLEAN-UP PREPARATIONS FOR THE ANNIVERSARY FESTIVITIES**

The preparations required the removal of junk and trash that accumulated in the Fellowship Hall. In addition, it was necessary to contract a floor cleaner to mop and buff the floor of the Fellowship Hall for the evening dinner.

#### ANNUAL FLOOR STRIP AND WAX

In October, the services of Big "E" floor service was contracted to strip, wax and polish the Fellowship Hall, Kitchen and corridor was completed.

**Purpose:** To provide meaningful worship services for the members of the First Presbyterian Church of South Charleston. Our goal is to creatively encourage diverse participation in our worship services and inspire our attendees to worship God and serve God through a variety of means such as motivational and inspiring preaching from Rev. Sharon Gearing, inspiring music from Dr. Mark Hornbaker, the choir, Presby Pealers, special musical guests, and faith stories from our members.

#### 2019 Highlights:

- We are so lucky to have had the continued dedicated leadership of our wonderful pastor, Reverend Sharon Gearing, who created and shared inspired and meaningful worship services throughout the year and encouraged committee members and the congregation to think bigger and outside the box. We were also very blessed to have new committee members Nancy Knurek and Myra Lilly. Dave Long also returned to the Worship Committee after a short stint on the Missions Committee.
- We are also thankful to have our brilliant Master of Music, Mark Hornbaker, who led our choir, Presby Pealers, and Wednesday night Music and Drama (MAD) group in creating beautiful music that inspired and uplifted our congregation each week. We are grateful that he has created and shared so many of his outstanding musical creations with our church and our community and brought in wonderful guest musicians throughout the year.
- We are incredibly grateful to our congregation for their participation in our worship services. We are especially grateful for the ushers, greeters, Sunday Samaritans, nursery caregivers, liturgists, assisting elders, communion preparers, choir members, choir interns, Presby Pealer members, special musicians, faith story tellers, and youth leadership who have made our worship services welcoming, inspiring, varied, and educational.
- In February, we commissioned the folks going on the Haiti Medical Mission.
- In early March we worshipped on Ash Wednesday to begin the season of Lent and in mid-March, we helped coordinate and participated in the wonderful celebration of "200 Years of Presbyterianism in the Kanawha Valley" at the Charleston Coliseum Little Theater with other area Presbyterian churches. March also included our annual Bluestone Sunday, with special music by Bluestone's Mark Miller and the Beans and Cornbread fundraiser for Bluestone.



- Palm Sunday began with a processional hymn and palm waving. Guest soloist/musician Amanda Bridgett blessed us with her wonderful voice and piano playing, and we watched a special "Hosanna!" video.
- On Maundy Thursday, we participated in a special Seder Supper, which included worship and communion, and the opportunity to sample the traditional Jewish dishes of a Seder meal.





• Easter Sunday began with the Flowering of the Cross as we assembled for Worship. The Easter Prelude, an original composition by Dr. Mark Hornbaker, included organ, trumpets and bells. The Cross then led the processional (Jesus Christ is Risen Today) to begin Worship, followed by the Bible, Pastor Gearing and the Acolyte. The worship service was a particularly special one, thanks to the leadership of Pastor Sharon, our Master of Music Mark and performance by the adult choir and special musical guests.





- Our Mother's Day service in May included a special video created by Youth Director Lisa Calderwood featuring the youth and others. All Mothers (and all females) also received a potted flower.
- June services included Pentecost and Father's Day. Each father received tickets to a WV Power game of their choice.
- In August, after months of planning and organization, we celebrated the 100th Anniversary of First Presbyterian Church, South Charleston with a theme of "Remembering the Past, Celebrating the Present, Growing the Future". The weekend of events culminated in our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Worship Service, which featured music by guest soloist Ashley Dannewitz, a very special "100 Years of Ministry" video featuring members young and old, and another original composition by Master of Music Mark Hornbaker (based on Psalms 121 and 122). Pastor Sharon also led a special sermon series on the Parables in August.
- On Music Memorial Sunday in November, we were inspired by the faith stories of members of our congregation on how music has shaped their faith in God, and we were moved by the beautiful music provided that day. We also celebrated communion that Sunday, and the Worship & Music Committee hosted church chat.
- December worship services included our annual Youth Christmas Program, led by Youth Director Lisa Calderwood and Dr. Hornbaker on the third Sunday of Advent. Jessica Martin shared her sign language talent while Collin Nelson sang "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming". Then during an extended Children's Time, an unusually large children's choir sang "The Little Drummer Boy" and "Silent Night", and Chace sang "Away in a Manger".

- That same evening in mid-December, under the direction of Mark Hornbaker, our adult choir, along with some very special guest musicians and singers, presented the Celtic Christmas Cantata "Tapestry of Light". Mark Hornbaker (piano), Paula Legge (organ), the choir, six additional instrumentalists, and Academy Singers, made this community outreach event a moving and inspiring celebration of the season.
- For our Christmas Eve service, the Celtic Christmas Cantata "Tapestry of Light" was presented by our adult choir, along with some very special guest musicians and singers, led by Mark Hornbaker. The congregation also sang traditional hymns, including "Silent Night" (by candlelight), and ended the service with "Joy to the World" with the Presby Pealers (and some special helpers) pealing joyfully and processing outside with the choir. All these components made for a beautiful and moving worship experience. Please check out the FPCSCWV webpage for pictures and videos of the Advent/Christmas Season.
- We worked with Pastor Sharon to strive to make our ordinary worship services meaningful as they make up the bulk of our worship services during the year. We did this by having special music and performances, active congregational participation, and inspiring sermons throughout the year.
- We revised the Church Wedding Policy which was utilized for the Tina Amburgey/Tim Dorsey wedding in early December.
- We coordinated Christmas Caroling to some of our shut-ins.
- We have been blessed by infants, toddlers, and young children participating in our childcare and nursery program with dedicated adults and young people assisting with this ministry.
- The organ and sanctuary piano received their yearly tuning and maintenance care.

#### **Behind the Scenes:**

In addition to Sunday morning services the Worship Committee was responsible for coordinating pulpit substitutes, assisting elders and liturgists, communion preparation, the alter guild, greeters, ushers, child caregivers and minutes for mission. We cannot thank the volunteers who participate in these important responsibilities enough. Worship and Music also participates in the Worship on Wednesday (WOW) program providing music for kids and youth.

#### 2020 Plans:

Our committee intends to build on our strengths, continue traditions of the congregation, and try new things. We look forward to continuing working with Pastor Sharon to provide fun, fulfilling and faith-building services and experiences for our members and guests. We plan to explore creative ways to use the large monitors in our sanctuary, as well as our live-streaming capabilities to create a contemporary, artistic worship and teaching space.

## Trustees 2019 Annual Report

West Virginia state law does not allow church congregations to hold direct title to property. Instead, each congregation owns property through trustees it appoints or elects.

The trustees of First Presbyterian Church - South Charleston are governed by article one, chapter thirty-five of the West Virginia Code and subsections G-401 and G-402 of the Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to buy and/or sell property and to sue and to be sued in the name of the church. Under First Presbyterian Church - South Charleston's Charter for Trustees, approved by the Congregation in 1987, the trustees acquire insurance to protect the church and its functions. They also hold and invest funds assigned to them by the Session.

Trustees manage six distinct funds on behalf of the Session and at the Session's direction. The Trustees currently use the professional fund management services of Anthony Mazelon at Hilliard-Lyons, Inc. in Charleston. In 2020, Hilliard Lyons, Inc. becomes Robert W. Baird & Co., simply known as "Baird."
